### Section I — Response to Prescribed Text Part A

#### Question 1 (a)

Criteria	Marks
• Demonstrates an understanding of Captain Kelly's view of the life of sailors	2
• Provides some relevant information	1

**Sample answer:**

Captain Kelly thinks that sailors live in an ongoing battle because they have to battle with storms. He also thinks that sailors lose their self-identity.

#### Question 1 (b)

Criteria	Marks
• Demonstrates a sound understanding of why Captain Kelly compares himself to a seashell	3
• Demonstrates some understanding of why Captain Kelly compares himself to a seashell	2
• Provides some relevant information	1

**Sample answer:**

Captain Kelly compares himself to a seashell because a seashell is rough from the outside but soft on the inside. The outside resembles his difficult and thorny life that he has lived in his exile and in his life as a sailor. It is soft on the inside because he has lost his love which makes him soft and weak inside his heart.

**Question 1 (c)**

**Sample answer:**

Captain Kelly has spent his life in two expatriations, one from his homeland and one from his love. He left his native country Lebanon to pursue his dream. However, after forty years outside of his homeland, he still feels the pull of his homeland. That's why he describes himself as a 'Lebanese in exile' in the conversation.

After losing his only love, Nadine, Captain Kelly decides to be a sailor wandering between the islands of tourism, hoping that one day he will find her face among the strangers. Between the nostalgia for his homeland Lebanon and the loss of his love, Captain Kelly feels 'the estrangement of homeland and the estrangement of love'.

**Sample answer:**

Captain Kelly has changed from being a private person to a person who would open his heart to a complete stranger. He did this because he felt connected with the narrator who was also from his native country. The narrator has demonstrated her ‘change’ from being a quiet and lonesome person sitting on the ship to an outgoing person actively engaging in a conversation with Captain Kelly.

In addition, Captain Kelly experiences ‘change’ when he decides to migrate. He changes from being young, loving and energetic to a man who lives in despair and loneliness. Nadine’s father has experienced the ‘change’ of social status from an unnoticeable person to a famous businessman who is rich enough to purchase a whole island. Furthermore, Nadine experiences a decision change. She was in love with Captain Kelly before meeting Kelly’s aunt but has changed her mind and decides not to continue the relationship with Captain Kelly.
