Sample answer:

Peter is likely to choose Chinese as he thinks he doesn't speak Japanese well. Moreover, his father wants him to do Chinese. Peter will likely choose Chinese as he likes Chinese history and speaks Chinese with his grandparents who live in Beijing.

Sample answer:

Both speakers have decided to go to the beach instead of jogging in the park. In the beginning, the male speaker suggests they exercise in the park whereas the female speaker wants to study for next week's exam. In the end they decide to go walking along the beach and leave the studying to Monday because they are both exhausted.

Moreover, Xiaohong points out the tickets are much cheaper to go to Italy than the USA.

People who like spicy food would also be interested because the restaurant has options such as Mapo tofu and hot and sour soup. Moreover, the restaurant also has sweet and sour dishes such as sweet and sour pork and lemon chicken would appeal to people who prefer sweet food. People who enjoy New Year entertainment would be interested because they can watch traditional performances. The restaurant is close to the train station so it would also attract people who value convenience.

For example, customers can bring their own pets and the cafe can look after their pets while they are away. The cafe also uses a special offer of only \$5 for coffee and pet cakes.

Sample answer:

Mary told Xiaoming that she likes the cold snowy weather when Xiaoming initially was worried about the cold weather. Mary would also be looked after by her mum's friend even if she got sick so Xiaoming didn't need to worry about that. When Xiaoming expressed his concern regarding money, Mary told him that she saved some money and she doesn't need to pay for accommodation as she is staying at her mum's friend's place. Mary clarified that she didn't like spicy Chinese food but she did like other food such as dumplings, buns and noodles when Xiaoming thought that Mary wouldn't like Chinese food.

Sample answer:

Lanlan is highly suitable for the job at the bubble tea shop because she has got previous experience at a bubble tea shop. She only watches TV and sleeps at home, which makes her available to work on weekends. Moreover, she meets the requirement of being able to speak Chinese as she has been studying Chinese for 5 years. She is suitable for this job as she likes to make friends, which matches the job description. This job offers 35 dollars per hour, and she needs the money to hang out with her friends.

Sample answer:

Liming and Xiaomei have different views on the issue of walking to school. Liming believes that it is fast and convenient to take the train to school, whereas Xiaomei thinks that walking is better than catching the train. Liming also feels it would be too tiring to carry lots of books. However, Xiaomei believes that they don't need lots of books anymore as they study using computers. Then Liming raised the concern about the time in walking long distances from home to school and while Xiaomei agrees that walking takes a long time, it is beneficial to health.
