Sample answer:

Participants will improve their knowledge of Italian culture and language, learn about local cooking and music and experience living in a Tuscan farmhouse.

Question 8

Sample answer:

Roberta's problem is that her parents are moving. She wants to keep playing volleyball as she will be team captain, but she can't get to training during the week, so she won't be able to play at the weekend. Roberta's friend says she can stay at his place, which would solve her problem but she doesn't want to disappoint her parents.

Sample answer:

Fabrizio says that reading classics can be a fun way to learn about history and how the world and people have changed. You can imagine the characters and the places for yourselves rather than following how the movies portray them. The reader also has more time to absorb the story and can become part of it. He suggests they read the book together.

Sample answer:

She is likely to follow her father's suggestions because all his points are connected to her interests. He points out that travelling around Italy and then staying in one Italian city would be more beneficial seeing she has studied Italian. He recommends Verona because it is a typical Italian city and she could stay with her relatives who live there. Furthermore, there is the beautiful arena where she could watch an opera performance, as she loves music. There are also many squares where she would be able to watch everyday life. Finally, he points out that she could visit Juliet's house which she would like since she studied the play.

That it is important to know where we came from. We can do this by knowing the traditions of our parents and grandparents.

Question 14 (b)

Sample answer:

Many young people visit their grandparents' home towns, they learn the language or dialect, sometimes a recipe, and they live as their grandparents do. They understand the importance of this part of their life.

Question 15

Sample answer:

Yes, Antonia is likely to get the job. She finishes her exams in October so she would be available for the job in November. She studied Italian at an advanced level at school and English is her native language, so she meets the language requirement. She worked part time for two years in a pre-school where she gained experience organising activities, looking after children and dealing with parents. Although she does not currently have a car, she does have a drivers' licence. Therefore, she fulfils the criteria contained in the advertisement.
