However Roberto didn't love the cold, but loved the Christmas markets.

**Sample answer:**

Francesco is also a photography student and the project is organising a sale of photos and sculpture to raise money for the animals and he has photos to donate.

He is also not interested in studying another language.

Despite the fact that he proposed to his girlfriend there, he is unlikely to return as he had a bad experience with the service, the food, the cutlery and the price.

**Sample answer:**

She is an appropriate candidate because although she has never been a lifeguard, she has all the other qualities required. She is never late for school or work. She is energetic and fit as she is the water polo captain and goes to the gym. She understands what working in a team means and the importance of valuing team members such as treating them well and encouraging them to do their best.

**Sample answer:**

The unique approach to discipline in this school is that they focus on helping students improve their behaviour, rather than punishing them, and to give back to the community. Kids reflect on themselves and their actions and reflect on how they can learn from their mistakes. They learn new skills (such as painting the gate etc) and through meditation they learn how to calm down and control their emotions. It's personalised as each student chooses what activity they will engage in, increasing responsibility.
