Section I — Response to Prescribed Text Part A

Question 1 (a)

Criteria	Marks
• Provides why Mika says ^{うそ} 。度もしてない	2
• Provides some relevant information	1

Sample answer:

Mika says ‘You are lying. You haven’t done it at all’ because she has just returned home to Daigo after having been away, and the house looks uncleaned/a mess, which shows that he hasn’t done any housework.

Question 1 (b)

Criteria	Marks
• Demonstrates a sound understanding of what Mika means by the statement	2
• Provides some relevant information	1

Sample answer:

By the statement ‘half-hearted way of living’, Mika means that she does not approve of Daigo’s encoffiner job. She is concerned about the ‘taboo’ aspect of this job and how their child will be affected by that.

Question 1 (c)

Sample answer:

'It will be sad' means that the bathhouse will be missed. Tsuyako's bathhouse was a place where people felt connected to the community and traditions. She was like a mother figure. Now she is gone and there is a great chance that the bathhouse will permanently close and the community has lost a place to connect with others, feel cared for and value the tradition of a bathhouse.

Question 1 (d)

Sample answer:

The significance/meaning of wiping the dead body's face is more than just cleaning it: it is part of the funeral/encoffining ritual of paying respect to that person. For Yamashita, this caring action makes him realise that he has neglected/not supported his mother.

Sample answer:

The first part of Scene A depicts a reunion between Mika and Daigo, showing a lack of connectedness, characterised by awkward, short utterances. Long camera shots and the physical separation of Daigo and Mika with a kitchen bench between them accentuate this lack of connectedness.

Close-up shots in the middle of the first scene show a brief but strong connection, with Mika's announcement to Daigo that she is pregnant.

The big rift between them is consolidated by the work phone call, when work is clearly a greater priority for Daigo than solving this personal relationship crisis.

In Scene B in the bathhouse, while Mika does not actually say anything, the focus on her changing facial expression shows that she is clearly moved by Daigo's meticulous and caring attitude towards his job, and she begins to accept it. This marks the start of Mika's reconnection with Daigo. The music also reflects this increasingly warm emotion.

In an earlier scene, when Daigo confesses to Mika about his cello debt, the lack of connection between them is highlighted. He has been lying to her. This takes place in a dimly lit room, where the cello is made to look larger than Daigo, as he is sitting down. Also, the camera is positioned above Daigo, as Mika often is, showing Daigo to be weaker in their relationship. Apart from close-up shots as Daigo confesses, the camera shots of Daigo and Mika are often long, to show the distance between them in their relationship.

Answers could include:

Alternative: Even Mika's pregnancy announcement in this extract is not enough to connect them.
