Furthermore, he finds it hard to believe that nowadays Daniela is highly regarded as a role model by the school community.

Driverless buses will also provide a more frequent service.

Question 13 (a)

Sample answer:

She wrote the diary entry because she needed to vent and reflect on whether she should leave her boyfriend now or after his birthday.

Sample answer:

The writer is likely to break up with Juan because she is unhappy in this relationship and it is affecting her health. Juan is possessive and won't let her go out with her friends. She feels that she needs to concentrate further on her studies and is too young to be in a serious relationship. They also have different interests.
