**Sample answer:**

Alejandra needs to take the bins/rubbish out and clean her room.

### Question 3

Criteria	Marks
• Identifies detailed information Natalie shares about Luisa	3
• Identifies some of the details Natalie shares about Luisa	2
• Provides some relevant information	1

**Sample answer:**

She is tall and funny. She is a footballer/soccer player/forward/striker/semi-professional player.

The speaker thinks everybody should do volunteering after school. It was the best decision because he found the love of his life. His students taught him to dance, and he is more confident as he can now communicate with people of all ages.

## Question 8

### **Sample answer:**

He is likely to get the job at the bookstore because he is studying literature at university which is the perfect education for this job. Although he has not previously worked in a bookstore, he has retail experience. However, there are two minor issues since he cannot work after 5 pm during the week and cannot start until the end of the month. Despite this, he is still likely to get the job because the interviewer says they can find a solution.

### **Sample answer:**

Initially he thinks that visiting the city of Salta is a bad idea because it is so far away and an expensive airfare. He also wants to go to the beach.

The female speaker explains to him that there is a deal of 50% discount if he buys tickets at the moment. She explains that although there are no beaches, there is a lake for fishing and swimming. He can also do cultural activities – which he likes. Based on the female's arguments, his opinion is beginning to shift.

Finally, she convinces him to travel by inviting him to travel with her.

• Provides some explanation of who is the most suitable candidate	2

**Sample answer:**

Marcos is most suitable as he fits the age bracket. He works well in a team. He is a basketball champion and therefore fits the fitness requirements. He is seen to be brave because he works as a lifeguard.

Juana could fit because she is strong, works well in a team and fits the height requirement. But she is too old.

Carlos fits the age and height requirements, and he is strong. However, he is not a team player, nor available on weekends.

**Question 12 (a)**

Criteria	Marks
• Explains the significance of the title in relation to both paragraphs	2
• Provides some relevant information	1

**Sample answer:**

The title is significant because it reflects that Marisol was able to help her family economically and study at university, things she was unable to do in Chile.

**Question 12 (b)**

Criteria	Marks
• Provides a comprehensive comparison of Marisol's experiences in Darwin and Melbourne with detailed references to the text	4
• Provides a sound comparison of Marisol's experiences in Darwin and Melbourne with references to the text	3
• Provides some comparison of Marisol's experiences in Darwin and Melbourne with some reference to the text	2
• Provides some relevant information	1

**Sample answer:**

Marisol had very different experiences in Darwin and Melbourne. In Darwin she struggled with the weather being very hot/humid while in Melbourne she liked the weather more.

The city size / her lack of English proficiency made it difficult for her to make friends in Darwin. But as her English improved she was able to make friends more easily in Melbourne.

She disliked her work in Darwin because her boss was mean whereas in Melbourne she had patient bosses.

**Question 13**

• Provides a comprehensive explanation of what Pablo's post reveals about his personality with detailed references to the text	6
• Provides a thorough explanation of what Pablo's post reveals about his personality with sound references to the text	5
• Provides a sound explanation of what Pablo's post reveals about his personality with references to the text	4
• Provides an explanation of what Pablo's post reveals about his personality with some references to the text	3
• Attempts to provide an explanation of what Pablo's post reveals about his personality	2
• Provides some relevant information	1

**Sample answer:**

Pablo's post reveals he is adventurous / a risk-taker because he recommends extreme sports such as skydiving / rockclimbing without a harness.

He is outgoing/social, making new friends by hitchhiking and staying in hostels. This shows he values making friends and meeting new people.

He is tight with money / cheap because he doesn't pay for accommodation or transport and prefers to eat at the market as it is much cheaper. This reflects his frugal nature.

They are cousins and classmates (they go to the same school).

**Question 14 (b)**

Criteria	Marks
• Identifies the plans that Fernando suggests in his first email	2
• Provides some relevant information	1

**Sample answer:**

He suggests travelling to South America in summer. He hopes to practise his Spanish more and to visit lots of places.

**Question 14 (c)**

Criteria	Marks
• Provides a comprehensive justification of the likelihood of Enrique travelling with Fernando with detailed references to the text	5
• Provides a thorough justification of the likelihood of Enrique travelling with Fernando with sound references to the text	4
• Provides a sound justification of the likelihood of Enrique travelling with Fernando with references to the text	3
• Provides some information why or why not Enrique might travel with Fernando	2
• Provides some relevant information	1

**Sample answer:**

It is unlikely that Enrique will go travelling with Fernando. He should have asked Enrique before buying tickets on his behalf. Enrique would have preferred travelling in winter as it is cheaper. Enrique does not speak Spanish and prefers to travel alone. He also wants to start studying straight away after school and work part time to save money.
