Sample answer:

Lucía has a negative attitude towards the siesta and thinks it is a waste of time. Lucia also believes that this tradition does not exist in the city.

Differently, Oscar has a positive attitude towards the siesta. He believes it is an important tradition to be respected. It also allows people to be more productive/creative/relaxed after the siesta as they get to rest.

Cati is unlikely to attend the party as there won't be any Latin music, which is the only one she dances to. Also, she won't know many of the other people because they are all Australians who don't speak Spanish. In addition to that, she will have to travel far to get there and hates to take the train. But she might want to attend because her friend could drive her home after the party and because Danilo is attending.

Sample answer:

The podcast host, Mateo, initially is convinced that university leads to success in life.

However, later he agrees with Paula that university might not be necessary. Paula explains that as an influencer she was able to travel and make a lot of money. She argues the only key to success is making connections and creativity which is not learnt at university.

Finally, he changes his mind back to his initial thinking when she laughs and states that she only has to be pretty and young to be successful in life.

Sample answer:

The tradition does not make sense for *Linda5* as she finds it horrible, while *EcoAmigo* sees value in protecting the tradition.

Even though he would like to protect the tradition, *EcoAmigo* argues that the festival of bulls is not good for the town as it leaves the streets full of rubbish and noise from the many tourists.

Both agree that the funding should go elsewhere. *Linda5* would like to see the funding being put into the arts (dance/music) while *EcoAmigo* would like to see the funding go into education/the school.

Sample answer:

The family will choose the farm stay as it suits all their needs. They are unlikely to choose the coastal stay because it only has three beds, and they are a family of five. This is the same for the mountain stay, which is a cabin for two people. The coastal stay is also close to the city which is not in their criteria. The mountain stay is not suitable, as the family specified they have a dog and it is not suitable for children. The farm is the best stay because it includes experiences that are ideal for families that want to connect with each other and nature. They can do fruit picking and interact with the farm animals, and there is no technology – which meets all their criteria.
