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Section I– Art in Ireland

1. **Newgrange** is an example of a Megalithic structure.

Answer (a), (b) and (c).

- (a) What was its function?
- (b) Describe and discuss this structure and how it was built.
- (c) Briefly describe and discuss the decoration on **one** of this monument's main features.
Illustrate your answer.

2. The **Gleninsheen Gorget** is an example of Bronze Age metalwork.

Answer (a), (b) and (c).

- (a) What was its function?
- (b) Describe and discuss how it was made, referring to material, techniques and decoration.
- (c) Briefly describe and discuss what you know about the Bronze Age people in Ireland.
Illustrate your answer.

3. The **Reask Pillar**, Co. Kerry, *illustrated on the accompanying sheet*, is an example of stone carving from the Early Christian period in Ireland.

Answer (a), (b) and (c).

- (a) What was its function?
- (b) Describe and discuss the form and decoration of this pillar.
- (c) Name, briefly describe and discuss **one** other stone carving you have studied from the Early Christian period.
Illustrate your answer.

4. The **Custom House** in Dublin is an example of Neoclassical architecture from the Georgian period.

Answer (a), (b) and (c).

- (a) Name the architect of this building.
- (b) Describe and discuss the location and structure of this building.
- (c) Briefly describe and discuss **one** decorative feature of this building.
Illustrate your answer.

5. The painting '**Hellelil and Hildebrand, the Meeting on the Turret Stairs**' by Frederic William Burton (1816-1900) is **illustrated on the accompanying sheet**.
Answer (a), (b) and (c).
(a) Describe and discuss this painting using the following headings:
- subject matter
 - composition
 - use of colour.
- (b) Describe and discuss the artist's painting techniques.
(c) Name, briefly describe and discuss **one** other figurative painting by an Irish artist.
Illustrate your answer.

6. '**The Family**' is a sculpture by Maurice Harron (b.1946) and is **illustrated on the accompanying sheet**.
Answer (a), (b) and (c).
(a) Describe and discuss this sculpture using the following headings:
- subject matter and treatment of the human figure
 - form/shape
 - texture and surface.
- (b) Describe and discuss the materials and techniques used.
(c) Name, briefly describe and discuss **one** other figurative Irish public sculpture.
Illustrate your answer.

7. Choose a work by **one** of the following artists:
- Daniel Maclise (1806-1870)
 - Jack B. Yeats (1871-1957)
 - Paul Henry (1876-1958)
 - Harry Clarke (1889-1931)
 - Louis le Brocquy (1916-2012)
 - Martin Gale (b.1949)
 - Geraldine O'Neill (b.1971).

(b) Describe and discuss your chosen work using the following headings:

- (c) Give some information about the life and work/career of your chosen artist.
